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PREFACE FROM THE EDITOR

Webster's paperbacks take advantage of the fact that classics are frequently assigned readings in English courses. By using a running English-to-German thesaurus at the bottom of each page, this edition of *Heart of Darkness* by Joseph Conrad was edited for three audiences. The first includes German-speaking students enrolled in an English Language Program (ELP), an English as a Foreign Language (EFL) program, an English as a Second Language Program (ESL), or in a TOEFL® or TOEIC® preparation program. The second audience includes English-speaking students enrolled in bilingual education programs or German speakers enrolled in English speaking schools. The third audience consists of students who are actively building their vocabularies in German in order to take foreign service, translation certification, Advanced Placement® (AP®)¹ or similar examinations. By using the Webster's German Thesaurus Edition when assigned for an English course, the reader can enrich their vocabulary in anticipation of an examination in German or English.

Webster's edition of this classic is organized to expose the reader to a maximum number of difficult and potentially ambiguous English words. Rare or idiosyncratic words and expressions are given lower priority compared to "difficult, yet commonly used" words. Rather than supply a single translation, many words are translated for a variety of meanings in German, allowing readers to better grasp the ambiguity of English, and avoid them using the notes as a pure translation crutch. Having the reader decipher a word's meaning within context serves to improve vocabulary retention and understanding. Each page covers words not already highlighted on previous pages. If a difficult word is not translated on a page, chances are that it has been translated on a previous page. A more complete glossary of translations is supplied at the end of the book; translations are extracted from Webster's Online Dictionary.

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PART I

The Nellie, a **cruising yawl**, swung to her anchor without a **flutter** of the sails, and was at rest. The flood had made, the wind was nearly calm, and being bound down the river, the only thing for it was to come to and wait for the turn of the tide.

The sea-reach of the Thames stretched before us like the beginning of an **interminable waterway**. In the **offing** the sea and the sky were **welded** together without a joint, and in the luminous space the **tanned** sails of the **barges** drifting up with the tide seemed to stand still in red clusters of canvas sharply **peaked**, with **gleams** of varnished sprits. A haze rested on the low shores that ran out to sea in **vanishing flatness**. The air was dark above Gravesend, and farther back still seemed condensed into a **mournful** gloom, **brooding** motionless over the biggest, and the greatest, town on earth.

The Director of Companies was our captain and our host. We four **affectionately** watched his back as he stood in the bows looking to **seaward**. On the whole river there was nothing that looked half so **nautical**. He resembled a pilot, which to a **seaman** is **trustworthiness personified**. It was difficult to realize his work was not out there in the luminous estuary, but behind him, within the brooding gloom.

Between us there was, as I have already said somewhere, the bond of the sea. Besides holding our hearts together through long periods of separation, it had the effect of making us tolerant of each other's yarns--and even convictions. The

Lawyer--the best of old fellows--had, because of his many years and many virtues, the only cushion on deck, and was lying on the only rug. The Accountant had brought out already a box of **dominoes**, and was toying **architecturally** with the bones. Marlow sat cross-legged right **aft**, leaning against the mizzen-mast. He had **sunken** cheeks, a yellow complexion, a straight back, an **ascetic** aspect, and, with his arms dropped, the palms of hands outwards, resembled an idol. The Director, satisfied the anchor had good hold, made his way aft and sat down amongst us. We exchanged a few words lazily. Afterwards there was silence on board the yacht. For some reason or other we did not begin that game of dominoes. We felt **meditative**, and fit for nothing but placid staring. The day was ending in a **serenity** of still and exquisite brilliance. The water shone **specifically**; the sky, without a **speck**, was a benign **immensity** of **unstained** light; the very mist on the Essex marshes was like a **gauzy** and **radiant** fabric, hung **from** the wooded rises inland, and **draping** the low shores in **diaphanous** folds. Only the gloom to the west, brooding over the upper reaches, became more **somber** every minute, as if angered by the approach of the sun.

And at last, in its curved and **imperceptible** fall, the sun sank low, and from glowing white changed to a dull red without rays and without heat, as if about to go out suddenly, stricken to death by the touch of that gloom brooding over a crowd of men.

Forthwith a change came over the waters, and the serenity became less brilliant but more profound. The old river in its broad reach rested **unruffled** at the decline of day, after ages of good service done to the race that peopled its banks, spread out in the tranquil dignity of a waterway leading to the **uttermost** ends of the earth. We looked at the **venerable** stream not in the vivid flush of a short day that comes and **departs** for ever, but in the august light of **abiding** memories. And indeed nothing is easier for a man who has, as the phrase goes, "followed the sea" with reverence and affection, than to evoke the great spirit of the past upon the lower reaches of the Thames. The tidal current runs to and fro in its **unceasing** service, crowded with memories of men and ships it had borne to the rest of home or to the battles of the sea. It had known and served all the

men of whom the nation is proud, from Sir Francis Drake to Sir John Franklin, knights all, **titled** and untitled--the great knights-errant of the sea. It had borne all the ships whose names are like **jewels** flashing in the night of time, from the Golden Hind returning with her round **flanks** full of treasure, to be visited by the Queen's Highness and thus pass out of the gigantic tale, to the Erebus and Terror, bound on other conquests-- and that never returned. It had known the ships and the men. They had sailed from Deptford, from Greenwich, from Erith-- the **adventurers** and the settlers; kings' ships and the ships of men on 'Change; **captains**, **admirals**, the dark "interlopers" of the Eastern trade, and the commissioned "generals" of East India **fleets**. Hunters for gold or pursuers of fame, they all had gone out on that stream, bearing the sword, and often the torch, **messengers** of the might within the land, **bearers** of a spark from the sacred fire. What **greatness** had not floated on the **ebb** of that river into the mystery of an unknown earth! . . . The dreams of men, the seed of **commonwealths**, the **germs** of empires.

The sun set; the dusk fell on the stream, and lights began to appear along the shore. The Chapman **lighthouse**, a three-legged thing erect on a mud-flat, **shone** strongly. Lights of ships moved in the fairway--a great stir of lights going up and going down. And farther west on the upper reaches the place of the **monstrous** town was still marked **ominously** on the sky, a brooding gloom in sunshine, a **lurid** glare under the stars.

"And this also," said Marlow suddenly, "has been one of the dark places of the earth."

He was the only man of us who still "followed the sea." The worst that could be said of him was that he did not represent his class. He was a seaman, but he was a **wanderer**, too, while most seamen lead, if one may so express it, a **sedentary** life. Their minds are of the stay-at-home order, and their home is always with them--the ship; and so is their country--the sea. One ship is very much like another, and the sea is always the same. In the **immutability** of their surroundings the foreign shores, the foreign faces, the changing immensity of life, **glide** past, **veiled** not by a sense of mystery but by a slightly disdainful

ignorance; for there is nothing mysterious to a seaman unless it be the sea itself, which is the mistress of his existence and as **inscrutable** as Destiny. For the rest, after his hours of work, a casual stroll or a casual **spree** on shore **suffices** to **unfold** for him the secret of a whole continent, and generally he finds the secret not worth knowing. The **yarns** of **seamen** have a direct simplicity, the whole meaning of which lies within the shell of a cracked nut. But Marlow was not typical (if his **propensity** to spin yarns be excepted), and to him the meaning of an episode was not inside like a **kernel** but outside, **enveloping** the tale which brought it out only as a glow brings out a **haze**, in the **likeness** of one of these **misty halos** that sometimes are made visible by the **spectral illumination** of moonshine.

His remark did not seem at all surprising. It was just like Marlow. It was accepted in silence. No one took the trouble to **grunt** even; and presently he said, very slow--

"I was thinking of very old times, when the Romans first came here, nineteen hundred years ago--the other day. . . . Light came out of this river since--you say Knights? Yes; but it is like a running blaze on a plain, like a flash of lightning in the clouds. We live in the flicker--may it last as long as the old earth keeps rolling! But darkness was here yesterday. Imagine the feelings of a commander of a fine--what d'ye call `em?--trireme in the Mediterranean, ordered suddenly to the north; run **overland** across the Gauls in a hurry; put in charge of one of these craft the legionaries,--a wonderful lot of handy men they must have been too--used to build, apparently by the hundred, in a month or two, if we may believe what we read. Imagine him here-- the very end of the world, a sea the **color** of lead, a sky the color of smoke, a kind of ship about as rigid as a concertina-- and going up this river with stores, or orders, or what you like. Sandbanks, marshes, forests, savages,--precious little to eat fit for a civilized man, nothing but Thames water to drink. No Falernian wine here, no going ashore. Here and there a military camp lost in a wilderness, like a needle in a bundle of hay--cold, fog, **tempests**, disease, exile, and death,-- death **skulking** in the air, in the water, in the bush. They must have been dying like flies here. Oh yes--he did it. Did it

very well, too, no doubt, and without thinking much about it either, except afterwards to **brag** of what he had gone through in his time, perhaps. They were men enough to face the darkness. And perhaps he was cheered by keeping his eye on a chance of promotion to the fleet at Ravenna by-and-by, if he had good friends in Rome and survived the awful climate. Or think of a decent young citizen in a toga--perhaps too much dice, you know--coming out here in the train of some **prefect**, or tax-gatherer, or trader even, to **mend** his fortunes. Land in a **swamp**, march through the woods, and in some inland post feel the **savagery**, the utter savagery, had closed round him,-- all that mysterious life of the wilderness that **stirs** in the forest, in the **jungles**, in the hearts of wild men. There's no initiation either into such mysteries. He has to live in the midst of the incomprehensible, which is also **detestable**. And it has a fascination, too, that goes to work upon him. The fascination of the abomination--you know. Imagine the growing **regrets**, the longing to escape, the powerless disgust, the surrender, the hate."

He paused.

"Mind," he began again, lifting one arm from the elbow, the palm of the hand outwards, so that, with his legs folded before him, he had the pose of a Buddha preaching in European clothes and without a lotus-flower--"Mind, none of us would feel exactly like this. What saves us is efficiency--the devotion to efficiency. But these chaps were not much account, really. They were no **colonists**; their administration was merely a squeeze, and nothing more, I suspect. They were **conquerors**, and for that you want only **brute** force-- nothing to boast of, when you have it, since your strength is just an accident arising from the weakness of others. They grabbed what they could get for the sake of what was to be got. It was just robbery with violence, **aggravated** murder on a great scale, and men going at it blind--as is very proper for those who tackle a darkness. The conquest of the earth, which mostly means the taking it away from those who have a different complexion or slightly **flatter** noses than ourselves, is not a pretty thing when you look into it too much. What **redeems** it is the idea only. An idea at the back of it; not a sentimental **pretense** but an idea;

and an **unselfish** belief in the idea--something you can set up, and bow down before, and offer a sacrifice to. . . ."

He broke off. Flames **glided** in the river, small green flames, red flames, white flames, pursuing, **overtaking**, joining, crossing each other-- then **separating** slowly or hastily. The traffic of the great city went on in the **deepening** night upon the **sleepless** river. We looked on, waiting patiently-- there was nothing else to do till the end of the flood; but it was only after a long silence, when he said, in a **hesitating** voice, "I suppose you fellows remember I did once turn fresh-water **sailor** for a bit," that we knew we were **fated**, before the ebb began to run, to hear about one of Marlow's **inconclusive** experiences.

"I don't want to bother you much with what happened to me personally," he began, showing in this remark the weakness of many **tellers** of tales who seem so often unaware of what their audience would best like to hear; "yet to understand the effect of it on me you ought to know how I got out there, what I saw, how I went up that river to the place where I first met the poor chap. It was the **farthest** point of navigation and the **culminating** point of my experience. It seemed somehow to throw a kind of light on everything about me-- and into my thoughts. It was somber enough too--and pitiful-- not extraordinary in any way--not very clear either. No, not very clear. And yet it seemed to throw a kind of light.

"I had then, as you remember, just returned to London after a lot of Indian Ocean, Pacific, China Seas--a regular dose of the East--six years or so, and I was **loafing** about, **hindering** you fellows in your work and **invading** your homes, just as though I had got a **heavenly** mission to **civilize** you. It was very fine for a time, but after a bit I did get tired of resting. Then I began to look for a ship--I should think the hardest work on earth. But the ships wouldn't even look at me. And I got tired of that game too.

"Now when I was a little chap I had a passion for maps. I would look for hours at South America, or Africa, or Australia, and lose myself in all the **glories** of exploration. At that time there were many blank spaces on the earth, and when I saw one that looked particularly **inviting** on a map (but they all look

that) I would put my finger on it and say, 'When I grow up I will go there.' The North Pole was one of these places, I remember. Well, I haven't been there yet, and shall not try now. The glamour's off. Other places were **scattered** about the Equator, and in every sort of *latitude* all over the two **hemispheres**. I have been in some of them, and . . . well, we won't talk about that. But there was one yet--the biggest, the most blank, so to speak-- that I had a **hankering** after.

"True, by this time it was not a blank space any more. It had got filled since my **boyhood** with rivers and lakes and names. It had ceased to be a blank space of **delightful** mystery--a white patch for a boy to dream **gloriously** over. It had become a place of darkness. But there was in it one river especially, a **mighty** big river, that you could see on the map, **resembling** an immense **snake uncoiled**, with its head in the sea, its body at rest **curving afar** over a vast country, and its tail lost in the **depths** of the land. And as I looked at the map of it in a **shop-window**, it **fascinated** me as a snake would a bird-- a silly little bird. Then I remembered there was a big concern, a Company for trade on that river. Dash it all! I thought to myself, they can't trade without using some kind of craft on that lot of fresh water--steamboats! Why shouldn't I try to get charge of one? I went on along Fleet Street, but could not shake off the idea. The snake had **charmed** me.

"You understand it was a Continental concern, that Trading society; but I have a lot of relations living on the Continent, because it's cheap and not so nasty as it looks, they say.

"I am sorry to own I began to worry them. This was already a fresh departure for me. I was not used to get things that way, you know. I always went my own road and on my own legs where I had a mind to go. I wouldn't have believed it of myself; but, then--you see--I felt somehow I must get there by hook or by **crook**. So I worried them. The men said 'My dear fellow,' and did nothing. Then--would you believe it?--I tried the women. I, Charlie Marlow, set the women to work-- to get a job. Heavens! Well, you see, the notion drove me. I had an aunt, a dear enthusiastic soul. She wrote: 'It will be delightful. I am ready to do anything, anything for you. It is a glorious idea. very high **personage** in the Administration, and also a man who has lots of influence with,' &c., &c. She was determined to make no end of fuss to get me appointed skipper of a river **steamboat**, if such was my fancy.

"I got my appointment--of course; and I got it very quick. It appears the Company had received news that one of their captains had been killed in a **scuffle** with the natives. This was my chance, and it made me the more anxious to go. It was only months and months afterwards, when I made the attempt to recover what was left of the body, that I heard the original quarrel arose from a misunderstanding about some hens. Yes, two black hens. Fresleven--that was the fellow's name, a Dane--thought himself **wronged** somehow in the bargain, so he went ashore and started to hammer the chief of the village with a stick. Oh, it didn't surprise me in the least to hear this, and at the same time to be told that Fresleven was the **gentlest, quietest** creature that ever walked on two legs. No doubt he was; but he had been a couple of years already out there engaged in the noble cause, you know, and he probably felt the need at last of asserting his self-respect in some way. Therefore he **whacked** the old **nigger mercilessly**, while a big crowd of his people watched him, **thunderstruck**, till some man,-- I was told the chief's son,--in desperation at hearing the old chap yell, made a tentative **jab** with a spear at the white man-- and of course it went quite easy between the shoulder-blades. Then the whole population cleared into the forest, expecting all kinds of **calamities** to happen, while, on the other hand, the steamer Fresleven commanded left also in a bad panic, in charge of the engineer, I believe. Afterwards nobody seemed to trouble much about Fresleven's remains, till I got out and stepped into his shoes. saying that, for a second or two, I felt as though, instead of going to the center of a continent, I were about to set off for the center of the earth.

"I left in a French **steamer**, and she called in every blamed port they have out there, for, as far as I could see, the sole purpose of landing soldiers and custom-house officers. I watched the coast. Watching a coast as it slips by the ship is like thinking about an **enigma**. There it is before you-- smiling, frowning, inviting, grand, mean, **insipid**, or savage, and always **mute** with an air of whispering, 'Come and find out!' This one was almost **featureless**, as if still in the making, with an aspect of monotonous **grimness**. The edge of a colossal jungle, so dark-green as to be almost black, **fringed** with white surf, ran straight, like a ruled line, far, far away along a blue sea whose glitter was blurred by a creeping mist. The sun was fierce, the land seemed to **glisten** and drip with steam. Here and there grayish-whitish **specks** showed up, **clustered** inside the white surf, with a flag flying above them perhaps. Settlements some centuries old, and still no bigger than pin-heads on the untouched expanse of their background. We **pounded** along, stopped, landed soldiers; went on, landed custom-house clerks to levy toll in what looked like a God-forsaken wilderness, with a tin shed and a **flag-pole** lost in it; landed more soldiers--to take care of the custom-house clerks, presumably. Some, I heard, got drowned in the surf; but whether they did or not, nobody seemed particularly to care. They were just flung out there, and on we went. Every day the coast looked the same, as though we had not moved; but we passed various places--trading places--with names like Gran' Bassam Little Popo, names that seemed to belong to some sordid farce acted in front of a sinister backcloth. The **idleness** of a passenger, my isolation amongst all these men with whom I had no point of contact, the oily and **languid** sea, the uniform **somberness** of the coast, seemed to keep me away from the truth of things, within the **toil** of a mournful and senseless **delusion**. The voice of the surf heard now and then was a positive pleasure, like the speech of a brother. It was something natural, that had its reason, that had a meaning. Now and then a boat from the shore gave one a momentary contact with reality. It was **paddled** by black fellows. You could see from afar the white of their **eyeballs glistening**. perspiration; they had faces like grotesque masks--these chaps; but they had bone, muscle, a wild vitality, an intense energy of movement, that was as natural and true as the surf along their coast. They wanted no excuse for being there. They were a great comfort to look at. For a time I would feel I belonged still to a world of straightforward facts; but the feeling would not last long. Something would turn up to scare it away. Once, I remember, we came upon a man-of-war anchored off the coast. There wasn't even a shed there, and she was **shelling** the bush. Nothing could happen. There was a touch of insanity in the proceeding, a sense of **lugubrious drollery** in the sight; and it was not **dissipated** by somebody on board **assuring** me earnestly there was a camp of natives--he called them enemies!-- hidden out of sight somewhere.

"We gave her her letters (I heard the men in that lonely ship were dying of fever at the rate of three a day) and went on. Nowhere did we stop long enough to get a **particularized** impression, but the general sense of vague and oppressive wonder grew upon me. It was like a weary pilgrimage amongst hints for nightmares.

two hundred miles farther on. So as soon as I could I made a start for a place thirty miles higher up.

"I had my passage on a little sea-going steamer. Her captain was a Swede, and knowing me for a seaman, invited me on the bridge. "A slight **clinking** behind me made me turn my head. Six black men advanced in a file, **toiling** up the path. They walked erect and slow, balancing small baskets full of earth on their heads, and the clink kept time with their footsteps. Black rags were wound round their **loins**, and the short ends behind **wagged** to and fro like tails. I could see every rib, the joints of their limbs were like knots in a rope; each had an iron collar on his neck, and all were connected together with a chain whose **bights** swung between them, **rhythmically** clinking. Another report from the cliff made me think suddenly of that ship of war I had seen firing into a continent. It was the same kind of ominous voice; but these men could by no stretch of imagination be called enemies. They were called criminals, and the outraged law, like the bursting shells, had come to them, an **insoluble** mystery from over the sea. All their **meager** breasts **panted** together, the violently **dilated** nostrils **quivered**, the eyes stared **stonily** uphill. They passed me within six inches, without a glance, with that complete, **deathlike** indifference of unhappy **savages**. Behind this raw matter one of the **reclaimed**, the product of the new forces at work, strolled **despondently**, carrying a rifle by its middle. He had a uniform jacket with one button off, and seeing a white man on the path, **hoisted** his weapon to his shoulder with **alacrity**. This was simple **prudence**, white men being so much alike at a distance that he could not tell who I might be. He was **speedily** reassured, and with a large, white, **rascally** grin, and a glance at his charge, seemed to take me into partnership in his **exalted** trust. After all, I also was a part of the great cause of these high and just proceedings.

"Instead of going up, I turned and descended to the left. My idea was to let that chain-gang get out of sight before I climbed the hill. You know I am not particularly tender; I've had to strike and to **fend** off. I've had to resist and to attack sometimes--that's only one way of resisting-- without counting the exact

cost, **according** to the demands of such sort of life as I had **blundered** into. I've seen the devil of violence, and the devil of greed, and the devil of hot desire; but, by all the stars! these were strong, **lusty**, red-eyed **devils**, that **swayed** and drove men--men, I tell you. But as I stood on this hillside, I **foresaw** that in the blinding sunshine of that land I would become **acquainted** with a **flabby**, pretending, weak-eyed devil of a **rapacious** and **pitiless** folly. How **insidious** he could be, too, I was only to find out several months later and a thousand miles farther. For a moment I stood appalled, as though by a warning. Finally I descended the hill, **obliquely**, towards the trees I had seen.

"I avoided a vast artificial hole somebody had been digging on the slope, the purpose of which I found it impossible to divine. It wasn't a quarry or a **sandpit**, anyhow. It was just a hole. It might have been connected with the **philanthropic** desire of giving the criminals something to do. I don't know. Then I nearly fell into a very narrow **ravine**, almost no more than a scar in the hillside. I discovered that a lot of imported drainage-pipes for the settlement had been tumbled in there. There wasn't one that was not broken. It was a **wanton smash-up**. At last I got under the trees. My purpose was to stroll into the shade for a moment; but no sooner within than it seemed to me I had stepped into a gloomy circle of some Inferno. The rapids were near, and an **uninterrupted**, uniform, **headlong**, rushing noise filled the mournful stillness of the grove, where not a breath stirred, not a leaf moved, with a mysterious sound--as though the tearing pace of the launched earth had suddenly become audible.

"Black shapes crouched, lay, sat between the trees, leaning against the **trunks**, clinging to the earth, half coming out, half **effaced** within the dim light, in all the attitudes of pain, abandonment, and despair. Another mine on the cliff went off, followed by a slight shudder of the soil under my feet. The work was going on. The work! And this was the place where some of the helpers had withdrawn to die.

"They were dying slowly--it was very clear. They were not enemies, they were not criminals, they were nothing earthly now,-- nothing but black shadows of disease and starvation, lying **confusedly** in the **greenish** gloom. Brought from

all the **recesses** of the coast in all the legality of time contracts, lost in **uncongenial** surroundings, fed on unfamiliar food, they **sickened**, became inefficient, and were then allowed to crawl away and rest. These **moribund** shapes were free as air--and nearly as thin. I began to distinguish the gleam of eyes under the trees. Then, glancing down, I saw a face near my hand. The black bones **reclined** at full length with one shoulder against the tree, and slowly the **eyelids** rose and the sunken eyes looked up at me, enormous and vacant, a kind of blind, white flicker in the depths of the **orbs**, which died out slowly. The man seemed young--almost a boy--but you know with them it's hard to tell. I found nothing else to do but to offer him one of my good Swede's ship's biscuits I had in my pocket. The fingers closed slowly on it and held--there was no other movement and no other glance. He had tied a bit of white **worsted** round his neck--Why? Where did he get it? Was it a badge--an ornament--a charm--a **propitiatory** act? Was there any idea at all connected with it? It looked startling round his black neck, this bit of white thread from beyond the seas.

"Near the same tree two more **bundles** of acute angles sat with their legs drawn up. One, with his chin propped on his knees, stared at nothing, in an intolerable and appalling manner: his brother **phantom** rested its forehead, as if overcome with a great **weariness**; and all about others were scattered in every pose of contorted collapse, as in some picture of a massacre or a **pestilence**. While I stood horror-struck, one of these creatures rose to his hands and knees, and went off on all-fours towards the river to drink. He lapped out of his hand, then sat up in the sunlight, crossing his **shins** in front of him, and after a time let his **woolly** head fall on his **breastbone**.

"I didn't want any more **loitering** in the shade, and I made haste towards the station. When near the buildings I met a white man, in such an unexpected elegance of get-up that in the first moment I took him for a sort of vision. I saw a high starched collar, white **cuffs**, a light **alpaca** jacket, **snowy** trousers, a clear **necktie**, and varnished boots. No hat. Hair parted, brushed, **oiled**, under a green-lined **parasol** held in a big white hand. He was amazing, and had a **penholder** behind his ear.

"I shook hands with this miracle, and I learned he was the Company's chief accountant, and that all the **bookkeeping** was done at this station. He had come out for a moment, he said, 'to get a breath of fresh air.' The expression sounded **wonderfully** odd, with its suggestion of sedentary desk-life. I wouldn't have mentioned the fellow to you at all, only it was from his lips that I first heard the name of the man who is so indissolubly connected with the memories of that time. Moreover, I respected the fellow. Yes; I respected his **collars**, his vast cuffs, his brushed hair. His appearance was certainly that of a hairdresser's **dummy**; but in the great **demoralization** of the land he kept up his appearance. That's **backbone**. His starched collars and got-up shirt-fronts were achievements of character. He had been out nearly three years; and, later on, I could not help asking him how he managed to sport such linen. He had just the faintest **blush**, and said **modestly**, 'I've been teaching one of the native women about the station. It was difficult. She had a **distaste** for the work.' This man had **verily** accomplished something. And he was devoted to his books, which were in apple-pie order.

"Everything else in the station was in a muddle,--heads, things, buildings. Strings of dusty **niggers** with **splay** feet arrived and departed; a stream of manufactured goods, **rubbishy cottons**, beads, and brass-wire set into the depths of darkness, and in return came a precious **trickle** of ivory.

"I had to wait in the station for ten days--an **eternity**. I lived in a hut in the yard, but to be out of the chaos I would sometimes get into the accountant's office. It was built of horizontal **planks**, and so badly put together that, as he bent over his high desk, he was **barred** from neck to heels with narrow strips of sunlight. There was no need to open the big **shutter** to see. It was hot there too; big flies **buzzed fiendishly**, and did not sting, but stabbed. I sat generally on the floor, while, of **faultless** appearance (and even slightly scented), perching on a high stool, he wrote, he wrote. Sometimes he stood up for exercise. When a truckle-bed with a sick man (some invalided agent from up-country) was put in there, he exhibited a gentle **annoyance**. 'The **groans** of this sick person,' he said,

distract my attention. And without that it is extremely difficult to guard against clerical errors in this climate.'

"One day he remarked, without lifting his head, 'In the interior you will no doubt meet Mr. Kurtz.' On my asking who Mr. Kurtz was, he said he was a first-class agent; and seeing my disappointment at this information, he added slowly, laying down his pen, 'He is a very remarkable person.' Further questions **elicited** from him that Mr. Kurtz was at present in charge of a trading post, a very important one, in the true ivory-country, at 'the very bottom of there. Sends in as much ivory as all the others put together. . . .' He began to write again. The sick man was too ill to **groan**. The flies buzzed in a great peace.

"Suddenly there was a growing **murmur** of voices and a great **tramping** of feet. A caravan had come in. A violent **babble** of **uncouth** sounds burst out on the other side of the planks. All the **carriers** were speaking together, and in the midst of the **uproar** the **lamentable** voice of the chief agent was heard 'giving it up' **tearfully** for the twentieth time that day. . . . He rose slowly. 'What a **frightful** row,' he said. He crossed the room gently to look at the sick man, and returning, said to me, 'He does not hear.' 'What! Dead?' I asked, startled. 'No, not yet,' he answered, with great **composure**. Then, **alluding** with a **toss** of the head to the **tumult** in the station-yard, 'When one has got to make correct entries, one comes to hate those savages-- hate them to the death.' He remained thoughtful for a moment. 'When you see Mr. Kurtz,' he went on, 'tell him from me that everything here'--he glanced at the desk--'is very satisfactory. I don't like to write to him--with those messengers of ours you never know who may get hold of your letter--at that Central Station.' He stared at me for a moment with his mild, **bulging** eyes. 'Oh, he will go far, very far,' he began again. 'He will be a somebody in the Administration before long. They, above--the Council in Europe, you know--mean him to be.'

"He turned to his work. The noise outside had ceased, and presently in going out I stopped at the door. In the steady buzz of flies the homeward-bound agent was lying flushed and **insensible**; the other, bent over his books, was making

correct entries of perfectly correct transactions; and fifty feet below the doorstep I could see the still tree-tops of the grove of death.

"Next day I left that station at last, with a caravan of sixty men, for a two-hundred-mile **tramp**.

"No use telling you much about that. Paths, paths, everywhere; a stamped-in network of paths spreading over the empty land, through long grass, through burnt grass, through **thickets**, down and up chilly **ravines**, up and down **stony** hills **ablaze** with heat; and a **solitude**, a solitude, nobody, not a hut. The population had cleared out a long time ago. Well, if a lot of mysterious niggers armed with all kinds of fearful weapons suddenly took to **traveling** on the road between Deal and Gravesend, catching the **yokels** right and left to carry heavy loads for them, I fancy every farm and cottage thereabouts would get empty very soon. Only here the dwellings were gone too. Still I passed through several abandoned villages. There's something **pathetically** childish in the ruins of grass walls. Day after day, with the stamp and **shuffle** of sixty pair of bare feet behind me, each pair under a 60-lb. load. Camp, cook, sleep, strike camp, march. Now and then a carrier dead in harness, at rest in the long grass near the path, with an empty water-gourd and his long staff lying by his side. A great silence around and above. Perhaps on some quiet night the **tremor** of far-off drums, sinking, **swelling**, a tremor vast, faint; a sound weird, appealing, **suggestive**, and wild--and perhaps with as profound a meaning as the sound of bells in a Christian country. Once a white man in an **unbuttoned** uniform, **camping** on the path with an armed escort of **lank** Zanzibaris, very **hospitable** and festive-- not to say drunk. Was looking after the **upkeep** of the road, he declared. Can't say I saw any road or any upkeep, unless the body of a middle-aged **negro**, with a bullet-hole in the forehead, upon which I absolutely stumbled three miles farther on, may be considered as a permanent improvement. I had a white companion too, not a bad chap, but rather too **fleshy** and with the **exasperating** habit of **fainting** on the hot **hillsides**, miles away from the least bit of shade and water. Annoying, you know, to hold your own coat like a parasol over a man's head while he is coming-to. I couldn't help asking him once what he meant by coming

there at all. 'To make money, of course. What do you think?' he said, **scornfully**. Then he got fever, and had to be carried in a **hammock slung** under a pole. As he weighed sixteen stone I had no end of rows with the carriers. They jibbed, ran away, **sneaked** off with their loads in the night-- quite a **mutiny**. So, one evening, I made a speech in English with gestures, not one of which was lost to the sixty pairs of eyes before me, and the next morning I started the hammock off in front all right. An hour afterwards I came upon the whole concern **wrecked** in a bush--man, hammock, groans, **blankets, horrors**. The heavy pole had **skinned** his poor nose. He was very anxious for me to kill somebody, but there wasn't the shadow of a carrier near. I remembered the old doctor,--'It would be interesting for science to watch the mental changes of individuals, on the spot.' I felt I was becoming **scientifically** interesting. However, all that is to no purpose. On the fifteenth day I came in sight of the big river again, and hobbled into the Central Station. It was on a back water surrounded by **scrub** and forest, with a pretty border of **smelly** mud on one side, and on the three others **inclosed** by a crazy fence of **rushes**. A neglected gap was all the gate it had, and the first glance at the place was enough to let you see the flabby devil was running that show. White men with long **staves** in their hands appeared **languidly** from amongst the buildings, **strolling** up to take a look at me, and then retired out of sight somewhere. One of them, a **stout, excitable** chap with black **mustaches**, informed me with great **volubility** and many **digressions**, as soon as I told him who I was, that my steamer was at the bottom of the river. I was thunderstruck. What, how, why? Oh, it was 'all right.' The 'manager himself' was there. All quite correct. 'Everybody had behaved **splendidly!** splendidly!--'you must,' he said in **agitation**, 'go and see the general manager at once. He is waiting!'

"I did not see the real significance of that wreck at once. I fancy I see it now, but I am not sure--not at all. Certainly the affair was too stupid--when I think of it--to be altogether natural. Still. . . . But at the moment it presented itself simply as a confounded nuisance. The steamer was sunk. They had started two days before in a sudden hurry up the river with the manager on board, in charge of some volunteer skipper, and before they had been out three hours they tore the

bottom out of her on stones, and she sank near the south bank. I asked myself what I was to do there, now my boat was lost. As a matter of fact, I had plenty to do in fishing my command out of the river. I had to set about it the very next day. That, and the repairs when I brought the pieces to the station, took some months.

"My first interview with the manager was curious. He did not ask me to sit down after my twenty-mile walk that morning. He was commonplace in **complexion**, in features, in manners, and in voice. He was of middle size and of ordinary build. His eyes, of the usual blue, were perhaps remarkably cold, and he certainly could make his glance fall on one as **trenchant** and heavy as an **ax**. But even at these times the rest of his person seemed to **disclaim** the intention. Otherwise there was only an **indefinable**, faint expression of his lips, something stealthy--a smile--not a smile--I remember it, but I can't explain. It was unconscious, this smile was, though just after he had said something it got **intensified** for an instant. It came at the end of his speeches like a seal applied on the words to make the meaning of the **commonest** phrase appear absolutely inscrutable. He was a common **trader**, from his youth up employed in these parts-- nothing more. He was **obeyed**, yet he inspired neither love nor fear, nor even respect. He inspired **uneasiness**. That was it! Uneasiness. Not a definite mistrust--just uneasiness--nothing more. You have no idea how effective such a . . . a . . . faculty can be. He had no genius for **organizing**, for initiative, or for order even. That was evident in such things as the **deplorable** state of the station. He had no learning, and no intelligence. His position had come to him--why? Perhaps because he was never ill . . . He had served three terms of three years out there . . . Because **triumphant** health in the general **rout** of **constitutions** is a kind of power in itself. When he went home on leave he **rioted** on a large scale-- pompously. Jack ashore--with a difference--in **externals** only. This one could gather from his casual talk. He **originated** nothing, he could keep the routine going--that's all. But he was great. He was great by this little thing that it was impossible to tell what could control such a man. He never gave that secret away. Perhaps there was nothing within him. Such a suspicion made one pause-- for out there there were no external checks. Once when various tropical

can have that pleasure. I wouldn't like him to get a false idea of my **disposition**. . . !

against, while he talked **fluently** about `the necessity for every man to get on.' `And when one comes out here, you **conceive**, it is not to gaze at the moon.' After all, for a seaman, to **scrape** the bottom of the thing that's supposed to float all the time under his care is the **unpardonable** sin. No one may know of it, but you never forget the thump--eh? A blow on the very heart. You remember it, you dream of it, you wake up at night and think of it--years after--and go hot and cold all over. I don't pretend to say that steamboat floated all the time. More than once she had to **wade** for a bit, with twenty **cannibals** **splashing** around and pushing. We had **enlisted** some of these **chaps** on the way for a crew. Fine fellows--cannibals--in their place. They were men one could work with, and I am grateful to them. And, after all, they did not eat each other before my face: they had brought along a provision of hippo-meat which went rotten, and made the mystery of the wilderness **stink** in my nostrils. Phoo! I can **sniff** it now. I had the manager on board and three or four pilgrims with their staves-- all complete. Sometimes we came upon a station close by the bank, **clinging** to the **skirts** of the unknown, and the white men rushing out of a tumble-down **hovel**, with great **gestures** of joy and surprise and welcome, seemed very strange,-- had the appearance of being held there **captive** by a spell. The word ivory would ring in the air for a while--and on we went again into the silence, along empty reaches, round the still **bends**, between the high walls of our winding way, **reverberating** in hollow **claps** the **ponderous** beat of the stern-wheel. Trees, trees, millions of trees, massive, immense, running up high; and at their foot, **hugging** the bank against the stream, crept the little

The steamer **toiled** along slowly on the edge of a black and incomprehensible **frenzy**. The prehistoric man was **cursing** us, praying to us, welcoming us--who could tell? We were cut off from the comprehension of our surroundings; we glided past like **phantoms**, wondering and secretly appalled, as **sane** men would be before an enthusiastic outbreak in a **madhouse**. We could not understand, because we were too far and could not remember, because we were traveling in the night of first ages, of those ages that are gone, leaving hardly a sign-- and no memories.

"The earth seemed **unearthly**. We are accustomed to look upon the **shackled** form of a **conquered** monster, but there-- there you could look at a thing monstrous and free. It was unearthly, and the men were--No, they were not

inhuman. Well, you know, that was the worst of it--this suspicion of their not being inhuman. It would come slowly to one. Joy, fear, sorrow, devotion, **valor**, rage--who can tell?-- but truth--truth stripped of its cloak of time. Let the fool **gape** and shudder--the man knows, and can look on without a wink. But he must at least be as much of a man as these on the shore. He must meet that truth with his own true stuff--with his own **inborn** strength. Principles? Principles won't do. Acquisitions, clothes, pretty rags--rags that would fly off at the first good shake. No; you want a deliberate belief. An appeal to me in this **fiendish** row--is there? Very well; I hear; I admit, but I have a voice too, and for good or evil mine is the speech that **cannot** be **silenced**. Of course, a fool, what with sheer fright and fine sentiments, is always safe. Who's that **grunting**? You wonder I didn't go ashore for a howl and a dance? Well, no--I didn't. Fine sentiments, you say? Fine sentiments, be hanged! I had no time. I had to mess about with white-lead and strips of **woolen** blanket helping to put **bandages** on those **leaky** steam-pipes--I tell you. I had to watch the steering, and **circumvent** those **snags**, and get the tin-pot along by hook or by crook. There was surface-truth enough in these things to save a wiser man. And between **whiles** I had to look after the savage who was **fireman**. He was an improved specimen; he could fire up a vertical boiler. He was there below me, and, upon my word, to look at him was as **edifying** as seeing a dog in a parody of **breeches** and a feather hat, walking on his hind-legs. A few months of training had done for that really fine chap. He **squinted** at the steam-gauge and at the water-gauge with an evident effort of intrepidity--and he had filed teeth too, the poor devil, and the wool of his **pate** shaved into queer patterns, and three ornamental scars

on each of his cheeks. crawled. Sometimes I would pick out a tree a little way ahead to measure our progress towards Kurtz by, but I lost it invariably before we got **abreast**. night. It did not shift or drive; it was just there, standing all round you like something solid. At eight or nine, perhaps, it lifted as a shutter lifts. eight hundred miles away. The whites, of course greatly **discomposed**, had besides a curious look of being painfully shocked by such an outrageous row. the wire itself, or made loops of it to **snare** the **fishes** with, I don't see what good their extravagant salary could be to them. I must say it was paid with a regularity worthy of a large and **honorable** trading company. For the rest, the only thing to eat-- though it didn't look **eatable** in the least--I saw in their possession was a few lumps of some stuff like half-cooked **dough**, of a dirty lavender color, they kept wrapped in leaves, and now and then swallowed a piece of, but so small that it seemed done more for the looks of the thing than for any serious purpose of **sustenance**. Why in the name of all the **gnawing** devils of hunger they didn't go for us--they were thirty to five-- and have a good tuck in for once, **amazes** me now when I think of it. They were big powerful men, with not much capacity to weigh the consequences, with courage, with strength, even yet, though their skins were no longer glossy and their muscles no longer hard. And I saw that something **restraining**, one of those human secrets that **baffle** probability, had come into play there. I looked at them with a swift **quicken**ing of interest-- not because it occurred to me I might be eaten by them before very long, though I own to you that just then I perceived-- in a new light, as it were-- how **unwholesome** the pilgrims looked, and I hoped, yes, I positively hoped, that my aspect was not so-- what shall I say?--so--unappetizing: a touch of fantastic vanity which fitted well with the dream-sensation that **pervaded** all my days at that time. Perhaps I had a little fever too. One can't live with one's finger **everlastingly** on one's pulse. I had often 'a little fever,' or a little touch of other things-- the **playful** paw-strokes of the wilderness, the preliminary **trifling** before the more serious onslaught which came in due course. Yes; I looked at them as you would on any human being, with a curiosity of their impulses, motives, capacities, weaknesses, when brought to the test of an **inexorable** physical necessity. Restraint! What possible restraint? Was it **superstition**, disgust, patience, fear--or some kind of primitive honor? No fear can stand up to hunger, no patience can wear it out, disgust simply does not exist where hunger is; and as to superstition, beliefs, and what you may call principles, they are less than **chaff** in a breeze. Don't you know the **devilry** of lingering starvation, its exasperating torment, its black thoughts, its somber and brooding **ferocity**? Well, I do. It takes a man all his inborn strength to fight hunger properly. It's

really easier to face bereavement, **dishonor**, and the **perdition** of one's soul--than this kind of prolonged hunger. Sad, but true. And these chaps too had no earthly reason for any kind of **scruple**. Restraint! I would just as soon have expected restraint from a **hyena prowling** amongst the **corpses** of a battlefield. But there was the fact facing me--the fact dazzling, to be seen, like the foam on the depths of the sea, like a **ripple** on an **unfathomable** enigma, a mystery greater--when I thought of it-- than the curious, inexplicable note of desperate grief in this savage clamor that had swept by us on the river-bank, behind the blind **whiteness** of the fog.

'It is very serious,' said the manager's voice behind me; 'I would be **desolated** if anything should happen to Mr. Kurtz before we came up.' I looked at him, and had not the slightest doubt he was sincere. He was just the kind of man who would wish to preserve appearances. That was his restraint. But when he muttered something about going on at once, I did not even take the trouble to answer him. I knew, and he knew, that it was impossible. Were we to let go our hold of the bottom, we would be absolutely in the air--in space. We wouldn't be able to tell where we were going to--whether up or down stream, or across--till we fetched against one bank or the other,--and then we wouldn't know at first which it was. Of course I made no move. I had no mind for a smash-up. You couldn't imagine a more deadly place for a **shipwreck**. Whether drowned at once or not, we were sure to **perish** speedily in one way or another. 'I **authorize** you to take all the risks,' he said, after a short silence. 'I refuse to take any,' I said shortly; which was just the answer he expected, though its tone might have surprised him. 'Well, I must **defer** to your judgment. You are captain,' he said, with marked **civility**. I turned my shoulder to him in sign of my appreciation, and looked into the fog. How long would it last? It was the most hopeless look-out. The approach to this Kurtz grubbing for ivory in the wretched bush was **beset** by as many dangers as though he had been an enchanted princess sleeping in a fabulous castle. 'Will they attack, do you think?' asked the manager, in a confidential tone.

"I did not think they would attack, for several obvious reasons. The thick fog was one. If they left the bank in their canoes they would get lost in it, as we would be if we attempted to move. It felt like it too--choking, warm, **stifling**. Besides, all I said, though it sounded extravagant, was absolutely true to fact. What we afterwards alluded to as an attack was really an attempt at **repulse**. The action was very far from being aggressive--it was not even defensive, in the usual sense: it was undertaken under the stress of desperation, and in its essence was purely protective.

"It developed itself, I should say, two hours after the fog lifted, and its **commencement** was at a spot, roughly speaking, about a mile and a half below Kurtz's station. We had just **floundered** and flopped round a bend, when I saw an **islet**, a mere **grassy hummock** of bright green, in the middle of the stream. It was the only thing of the kind; but as we opened the reach more, I perceived it

was the head of a long **sandbox**, or rather of a chain of shallow patches stretching down the middle of the river. ankles, and thought all the world of himself. He was the most unstable kind of fool I had ever seen. He **steered** with no end of a **swagger** while you were by; but if he lost sight of you, he became instantly the prey of an **abject funk**, and would let that **cripple** of a steamboat get the upper hand of him in a minute.

"I was looking down at the sounding-pole, and feeling much annoyed to see at each try a little more of it stick out of that river, when I saw my poleman give up the business suddenly, and stretch himself flat on the deck, without even taking the trouble to haul his pole in. He kept hold on it though, and it trailed in the water. At the same time the fireman, whom I could also see below me, sat down abruptly before his **furnace** and **ducked** his head. I was amazed. Then I had to look at the river mighty quick, because there was a snag in the **fairway**. Sticks, little sticks, were flying about--thick: they were **whizzing** before my nose, dropping below me, striking behind me against my pilot-house. All this time the river, the shore, the woods, were very quiet-- perfectly quiet. I could only hear the heavy splashing **thump** of the stern-wheel and the **patter** of these things. We cleared the snag **clumsily**. Arrows, by Jove! We were being shot at! I stepped in quickly to close the shutter on the land side. That fool-helmsman, his hands on the **spokes**, was lifting his knees high, stamping his feet, **champing** his mouth, like a reined-in horse. **Confound** him! And we were staggering within ten feet of the bank. I had to lean right out to swing the heavy shutter, and I saw a face amongst the leaves on the level with my own, looking at me very fierce and steady; and then suddenly, as though a veil had been removed from my eyes, I made out, deep in the tangled gloom, naked breasts, arms, legs, glaring eyes,--the bush was **swarming** with human limbs in movement, glistening, of bronze color. The twigs shook, **swayed**, and **rustled**, the arrows flew out of them, and then the shutter came to. 'Steer her straight,' I said to the helmsman. He held his head rigid, face forward; but his eyes rolled, he kept on lifting and setting down his feet gently, his mouth **foamed** a little. 'Keep quiet!' I said in a fury. I might just as well have ordered a tree not to sway in the wind. I **darted** out. Below me there was a great scuffle of feet on the iron deck; confused **exclamations**; a voice screamed, 'Can you turn back?' I caught shape of a V-shaped ripple on the water ahead. What? Another snag! A **fusillade** burst out under my feet. The pilgrims

had opened with their Winchesters, and were simply **squirting** lead into that bush. A deuce of a lot of smoke came up and drove slowly forward. I swore at it. "For the moment that was the dominant thought. There was a sense of extreme disappointment, as though I had found out I had been **striving** after something altogether without a substance. You should have heard the **disinterred** body of Mr. Kurtz saying, 'My Intended.' You would have perceived directly then how completely she was out of it. And the lofty **frontal** bone of Mr. Kurtz! They say the hair goes on growing sometimes, but this--ah specimen, was **impressively** bald. The wilderness had patted him on the head, and, **behold**, it was like a ball--an ivory ball; it had **caressed** him, and--lo!-- he had **withered**; it had taken him, loved him, embraced him, got into his veins, consumed his flesh, and sealed his soul to its own by the inconceivable ceremonies of some **devilish** initiation. He was its spoiled and **pampered favorite**. Ivory? I should think so. **Heaps** of it, **stacks** of it. The old

mud **shanty** was **bursting** with it. You would think there was not a single **tusk** left either above or below the ground in the whole country. Everything belonged to him--but that was a **trifle**. The thing was to know what he belonged to, how many powers of darkness claimed him for their own. That was the reflection that made you creepy all over. It was impossible--it was not good for one either--trying to imagine. He had taken a high seat amongst the devils of the land-- I mean literally. You can't understand. How could you?-- with solid pavement under your feet, surrounded by kind **neighbors** ready to cheer you or to fall on you, stepping **delicately** between the butcher and the policeman, in the holy terror of scandal and **gallows** and **lunatic** asylums--how can you imagine what particular region of the first ages a man's **untrammeled** feet may take him into by the way of solitude--utter solitude without a policeman-- by the way of silence, **utter** silence, where no warning voice of a kind neighbor can be heard **whispering** of public opinion? These little things make all the great difference. When they are gone you must fall back upon your own **innate** strength, upon your own capacity for **faithfulness**. Of course you may be too much of a fool to go wrong--too dull even to know you are being **assaulted** by the powers of darkness. I take it, no fool ever made a bargain for his soul with the devil: the fool is too much of a fool, or the devil too much of a devil-- I don't know which. Or you may be such a **thunderingly** exalted creature as to be altogether deaf and blind to anything but heavenly **sights** and sounds. Then the earth for you is only a standing place-- and whether to be like this is your loss or your gain I won't

pretend to say. But most of us are neither one nor the other. The earth for us is a place to live in, where we must put up with sights, with sounds, with **smells** too, by Jove!--breathe dead hippo, so to speak, and not be **contaminated**. And there, don't you see? Your strength comes in, the faith in your ability for the **digging** of **unostentatious** holes to bury the stuff in--your power of devotion, not to yourself, but to an obscure, back-breaking business. And that's difficult enough. Mind, I am not trying to excuse or even explain--I am trying to account to myself for--for--Mr. Kurtz-- for the shade of Mr. Kurtz. This initiated **wraith** from the back of Nowhere **honored** me with its amazing confidence before it vanished altogether. This was because it could speak English to me. The original Kurtz had been educated partly in England, and--as he was good enough to say himself--his sympathies were in the right place. His mother was half-English, his father was half-French. All Europe contributed to the making of Kurtz; and by-and-by I learned that, most appropriately, the International Society for the Suppression of Savage Customs had intrusted him with the making of a report, for its future guidance. And he had written it too. I've seen it. I've read it. It was **eloquent**, **vibrating** with **eloquence**, but too high-strung, I think. Seventeen pages of close writing he had found time for! But this must have been before his-- let us say--nerves, went wrong, and caused him to **preside** at certain midnight **dances** ending with **unspeakable rites**, which--as far as I reluctantly gathered from what I heard at various times-- were offered up to him--do you understand?--to Mr. Kurtz himself. But it was a beautiful piece of writing. The opening paragraph, however, in the light of later information, strikes me now as ominous. He began with the argument that we whites, from the point of development we had arrived at, 'must necessarily appear to them [savages] in the nature of supernatural beings--we approach them with the might as of a deity,' and so on, and so on. 'By the simple exercise of our will we can **exert** a power for good practically **unbounded**,' &c., &c. From that point he **soared** and took me with him. The **peroration** was magnificent, though difficult to remember, you know. It gave me the notion of an exotic Immensity ruled by an august Benevolence. It made me **tingle** with enthusiasm. This was the unbounded power of eloquence--of words-- of burning noble words. There were

no practical **hints** to interrupt the magic current of phrases, unless a kind of note at the foot of the last page, **scrawled** evidently much later, in an **unsteady** hand, may be regarded as the **exposition** of a method. It was very simple, and at the end of that moving appeal to every **altruistic sentiment** it **blazed** at you, luminous and terrifying, like a flash of lightning in a **serene** sky: 'Exterminate all the brutes!' The curious part was that he had apparently forgotten all about that valuable postscriptum, because, later on, when he in a sense came to himself, he repeatedly **entreated** me to take good care of 'my pamphlet' (he called it), as it was sure to have in the future a good influence upon his career. I've done enough for it to give me the **indisputable** right to lay it, if I choose, for an everlasting rest in the **dust-bin** of progress, amongst all the **sweepings** and, **figuratively** speaking, all the dead cats of civilization. But then, you see, I can't choose. He won't be forgotten. Whatever he was, he was not common. He had the power to charm or frighten **rudimentary souls** into an aggravated witch-dance in his honor; he could also fill the small souls of the pilgrims with bitter **misgivings**: he had one devoted friend at least, and he had conquered one soul in the world that was neither rudimentary nor **tainted** with self-seeking. No; I can't forget him, though I am not prepared to **affirm** the fellow was exactly worth the life we lost in getting to him. I missed my late helmsman awfully,--I missed him even while his body was still lying in the pilot-house. Perhaps you will think it passing strange this regret for a savage who was no more account than a grain of sand in a black Sahara. Well, don't you see, he had done something, he had steered; for months I had him at my back--a help--an instrument. It was a kind of partnership. He steered for me--I had to look after him, I worried about his **deficiencies**, and thus a subtle bond had been created, of which I only became aware when it was suddenly broken. And the intimate **profundity** of that look he gave me when he received his hurt remains to this day in my memory--like a claim of distant kinship **affirmed** in a supreme moment.

"Poor fool! If he had only left that shutter alone. He had no restraint, no restraint--just like Kurtz--a tree swayed by the wind. As soon as I had put on a

that lake. 'Kurtz got the **tribe** to follow him, did he?' I suggested. He fidgeted a little. 'They **adored** him,' he said. assured in any case,' I affirmed, steadily. I did not want to have the **throttling** of him, you understand--and indeed it would have been very little use for any practical purpose. If anybody had ever struggled with a soul, I am the man. And I wasn't arguing with a lunatic either. Believe me or not, his intelligence was perfectly clear--concentrated, it is true, upon himself with horrible intensity, yet clear; and **therein** was my only chance--barring, of course, the killing him there and then, which wasn't so good, on account of unavoidable noise. But his soul was mad. Being alone in the wilderness, it had looked within itself, and, by heavens! I tell you, it had gone mad. I had--for my **sins**, I suppose--to go through the **ordeal** of looking into it myself. No eloquence could have been so **withering** to one's belief in mankind as his final burst of **sincerity**. He struggled with himself, too. I saw it,--I heard it. I saw the inconceivable mystery of a soul that knew no restraint, no faith, and no fear, yet struggling **blindly** with itself. I kept my head pretty well; but when I had him at

The wastes of his weary brain were **haunted** by shadowy images now--images of wealth and fame **revolving** **obsequiously** round his unextinguishable gift of noble and lofty expression. My Intended, my station, my career, my ideas-- these were the subjects for the occasional utterances of **elevated sentiments**. The shade of the original Kurtz **frequented** the bedside of the hollow **sham**, whose fate it was to be buried presently in the **mold** of primeval earth. But both the **diabolic** love and the

unearthly hate of the mysteries it had penetrated fought for the possession of that soul satiated with primitive emotions, **avid** of lying fame, of sham distinction, of all the appearances of success and power.

"We broke down--as I had expected--and had to lie up for repairs at the head of an island. This delay was the first thing that shook Kurtz's confidence. One morning he gave me a packet of papers and a photograph,-- the lot tied together with a shoe-string. 'Keep this for me,' he said. 'This **noxious** fool' (meaning the manager) 'is capable of **prying** into my boxes when I am not looking.' In the afternoon I saw him. He was lying on his back with closed eyes, and I withdrew quietly, but I heard him mutter, 'Live rightly, die, die . . .' I listened. There was nothing more. Was he **rehearsing** some speech in his sleep, or was it a fragment of a phrase from some newspaper article? He had been writing for the papers and meant to do so again, 'for the **furthering** of my ideas. It's a duty.'

"His was an impenetrable darkness. I looked at him as you peer down at a man who is lying at the bottom of a **precipice** where the sun never **shines**. But I had not much time to give him, because I was helping the engine-driver to take to pieces the leaky **cylinders**, to **straighten** a bent connecting-rod, and in other such matters. I lived in an infernal mess of **rust**, **filings**, nuts, bolts, **spanners**, **hammers**, ratchet-drills--things I **abominate**, because I don't get on with them. I

I saw on that ivory face the expression of somber pride, of **ruthless** power, of **craven** terror--of an intense and hopeless despair. Did he live his life again in every detail of desire, temptation, and surrender during that supreme moment of complete knowledge? He cried in a whisper at some image, at some vision,--he cried out twice, a cry that was no more than a breath--

"`The horror! The horror!'

"I blew the candle out and left the cabin. The pilgrims were dining in the mess-room, and I took my place opposite the manager, who lifted his eyes to give me a questioning glance, which I successfully ignored. He leaned back, serene, with that peculiar smile of his **sealing** the **unexpressed** depths of his **meanness**. A continuous shower of small flies streamed upon the lamp, upon the cloth, upon our hands and faces. Suddenly the manager's boy put his **insolent** black head in the doorway, and said in a tone of scathing contempt--

"`Mistah Kurtz--he dead.'

"All the pilgrims rushed out to see. I remained, and went on with my dinner. I believe I was considered **brutally callous**. However, I did not eat much. There was a lamp in there--light, don't you know--and outside it was so beastly, beastly dark. I went no more near the remarkable man who had pronounced a judgment upon the **adventures** of his soul on this earth. The voice was gone. What else had been there? But I am of course aware that next day the pilgrims buried something in a **muddy** hole.

"And then they very nearly buried me.

"However, as you see, I did not go to join Kurtz there and then. I did not. I remained to dream the nightmare out to the end, and to show my loyalty to Kurtz once more. Destiny. My destiny! Droll thing life is-- that mysterious arrangement of **merciless** logic for a futile purpose. The most you can hope from it is some knowledge of yourself--that comes too late--a crop of unextinguishable regrets. I have **wrestled** with death. It is the most **unexciting** contest you can imagine. It takes place in an impalpable **grayness**, with nothing **underfoot**, with nothing around, without **spectators**, without clamor, without glory, without the great desire of victory, without the great fear of defeat, in a **sickly** atmosphere of **tepid skepticism**, without much belief in your own right, and still less in that of your **adversary**. If such is the form of ultimate wisdom, then life is a greater **riddle** than some of us think it to be. I was within a hair's-breadth of the last opportunity for **pronouncement**, and I found with humiliation that probably I would have nothing to say. This is the reason why I affirm that Kurtz was a remarkable man. He had something to say. He said it. Since I had peeped over the edge myself, I understand better the meaning of his stare, that could not see the flame of the candle, but was wide enough to embrace the whole universe, **piercing** enough to **penetrate** all the hearts that beat in the darkness. He had **summed** up--he had judged. 'The horror!' He was a remarkable man. After all, this was the expression of some sort of belief; it had **candor**, it had conviction, it had a vibrating note of revolt in its whisper, it had the appalling face of a **glimpsed** truth--the strange commingling of desire and hate. And it is not my own extremity I remember best-- a vision of grayness without form filled with physical pain, and a careless contempt for the **evanescence** of all things--even of this pain itself. No! It is his extremity that I seem to have lived through. True, he had made that last **stride**, he had stepped over the edge, while I had been permitted to draw back my hesitating foot. And perhaps in this is the whole difference; perhaps all the wisdom, and all truth, and all sincerity, are just **compressed** into that **inappreciable** moment of time in which we step over the threshold of the invisible. Perhaps! I like to think my summing-up would not have been a word of careless contempt. Better his cry--much better. It was an

affirmation, a moral victory paid for by innumerable **defeats**, by **abominable terrors**, by abominable **satisfactions**. But it was a victory! That is why I have remained loyal to Kurtz to the last, and even beyond, when a long time after I heard once more, not his own voice, but the echo of his magnificent eloquence thrown to me from a soul as **translucently** pure as a cliff of crystal.

"No, they did not bury me, though there is a period of time which I remember **mistily**, with a **shuddering** wonder, like a passage through some inconceivable world that had no hope in it and no desire. I found myself back in the sepulchral city **resenting** the sight of people hurrying through the streets to **filch** a little money from each other, to **devour** their infamous cookery, to **gulp** their unwholesome beer, to dream their insignificant and silly dreams. They **trespassed** upon my thoughts. They were intruders whose knowledge of life was to me an **irritating** pretense, because I felt so sure they could not possibly know the things I knew. Their bearing, which was simply the bearing of commonplace individuals going about their business in the assurance of perfect safety, was offensive to me like the outrageous flauntings of folly in the face of a danger it is unable to comprehend. I had no particular desire to **enlighten** them, but I had some difficulty in restraining myself from laughing in their faces, so full of stupid importance. I dare say I was not very well at that time. I **tottered** about the streets--there were various affairs to settle--grinning bitterly at perfectly respectable persons. I admit my **behavior** was **inexcusable**, but then my temperature was seldom normal in these days. My dear aunt's **endeavors** to 'nurse up my strength' seemed altogether beside the mark. It was not my strength that wanted nursing, it was my imagination that wanted soothing. I kept the bundle of papers given me by Kurtz, not knowing exactly what to do with it. His mother had died lately, watched over, as I was told, by his Intended. A clean-shaved man, with an official manner and wearing gold-rimmed spectacles, called on me one day and made inquiries, at first **circuitous**, afterwards **suavely** pressing, about what he was pleased to **denominate** certain 'documents.' I was not surprised, because I had had two rows with the manager on the subject out there. I had refused to give up the smallest scrap out of that package, and I took the same attitude with the **spectacled** man. He became

darkly menacing at last, and with much heat argued that the Company had the right to every bit of information about its 'territories.' And, said he, 'Mr. Kurtz's knowledge of **unexplored** regions must have been necessarily extensive and peculiar--owing to his great abilities and to the deplorable circumstances in which he had been placed: therefore'--I assured him Mr. Kurtz's knowledge, however extensive, did not bear upon the problems of commerce or administration. He **invoked** then the name of science. 'It would be an **incalculable** loss if,' &c., &c. I offered him the report on the 'Suppression of Savage Customs,' with the postscriptum torn off. He took it up eagerly, but ended by **sniffing** at it with an air of contempt. 'This is not what we had a right to expect,' he remarked. 'Expect nothing else,' I said. 'There are only private letters.' He withdrew upon some threat of legal proceedings, and I saw him no more; but another fellow, calling himself Kurtz's cousin, appeared two days later, and was anxious to hear all the details about his dear relative's last moments. Incidentally he gave me to understand that Kurtz had been essentially a great **musician**. 'There was the making of an immense success,' said the man, who was an **organist**, I believe, with lank gray hair flowing over a **greasy** coat-collar. I had no reason to doubt his statement; and to this day I am unable to say what was Kurtz's profession, whether he ever had any--which was the greatest of his talents. I had taken him for a painter who wrote for the papers, or else for a journalist who could paint--but even the cousin (who took **snuff** during the interview) could not tell me what he had been--exactly. He was a universal genius--on that point I agreed with the old chap, who thereupon blew his nose **noisily** into a large cotton handkerchief and withdrew in **senile** agitation, bearing off some family letters and **memoranda** without importance. Ultimately a journalist anxious to know something of the fate of his 'dear colleague' turned up. This visitor informed me Kurtz's proper sphere ought to have been politics 'on the popular side.' He had **furry** straight eyebrows, **bristly** hair **cropped** short, an eye-glass on a broad ribbon, and, becoming **expansive**, **confessed** his opinion that Kurtz really couldn't write a bit--'but heavens! how that man could talk! He **electrified** large meetings. He had faith--don't you see?--he had the faith. He could get himself to believe anything--anything. He would have been a splendid
