Spam: Junk e-mail sent to many people at once, usually involving advertising or offering services.

Hardware: Pieces of equipment, such as the computer, keyboard, webcam etc.

Crash: When your computer suddenly stops working.

Hacker: A computer expert who can break through security to damage computers with viruses or steal data.

Firewall: A program which protects your computer from damage by other users.

Bookmark: A way of marking an internet website so that you can find it easily.

Virus: A piece of software that is on your computer without your permission and runs against your wishes.

Broadband: A permanent high-speed internet connection.

Cursor: This thing on your screen can indicate two things: 1) where your mouse pointer is, or 2) where the next character typed will be entered in a line of text.

Upload: To move a file from your computer onto the internet.

Upgrade: To replace something with a newer version.

Hyperlink: A word, phrase, or image that you can click on to move to a new document or a new section within the current document.

Click: To push one of the buttons on the mouse.

Address bar: The area where you type the address of the web site you want to view.

Download: To move a file from the internet to your computer.

Blog: An online personal diary with thoughts and opinions as well as links to other websites.

Browser: A program you use to view websites.

Icon: A small picture on the screen that shows the type of file or programme.
