Objectives of the Lesson

- To highlight the characteristics of each type.
- To help you distinguish between these types when reading or writing.

Text Types:

Text types are basic writing styles that seek to narrate, describe, instruct, explain, inform or persuade the reader. There are five main types as shown in the following table:

Text Type	Definition	Characteristics	Examples
Narrative	It is a text type that narrates an event, either imaginary or real.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The indication of settings. -The sequence of events using adverbs (first, second, then, next, finally). -The use of dynamic verbs (verbs that show a physical action). -The use of past tenses. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Fictional: novels, short stories. -Nonfictional: reports, newspapers.
Descriptive	It is a text type that describes a person, a place or a thing.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The use of state verbs (verbs that show a mental/abstract action). -The use of past and present tenses. -The excessive use of nouns and adjectives. - The use of adjectives (manner and place). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Biographies. - Landscapes.
Expository	It is a text type that informs, explains and gives details about a specific phenomenon. It can be historic, economic or scientific.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The sequence of events. -The use of present/past tenses. -The appearance of definitions and explanations. -The use of state verbs. -The use of technical terms. -The insertion of tables, figures and graphs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Text books. -Lectures.
Argumentative	It is a text type that seeks to convince the reader with a different point of view or an idea.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -The indication of the point of view to be defended. -The use of arguments. -The use of illustrations, data, facts and examples. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Debate papers.
