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Objectives of the Lesson

- > To introduce you to the different types of paragraphs you may come across.
- > To indicate the characteristics of each type, so you can distinguish between them

when reading or writing.

Types of Paragraphs:

There are five main types of paragraphs that are commonly used for the sake of describing, narrating, persuading, explain or illustrating a given idea. The following table introduces the five types.

Paragraph Types	Definition	Characteristics
Descriptive	It describes a thing, a person or a place in a given setting.	 The use of nouns, adjectives and adverbs. The use of state verbs. The use of present and past tenses.
Narrative	It tells or narrates a specific event.	 The sequence of events using sequencing adverbs. The use of dynamic verbs. The use of modal verbs. The use of past tenses.
Expository	It generally explains a procedure or gives instructions about a pre- denoted topic.	 The use of dynamic verbs. The sequence of events. The use of definitions, explanations, facts and lists. The use of present or imperative tenses.
Persuasive	It exposes the reader to a specific idea or point of view	-The use of arguments, facts and data.
