Tenses indicate when an action happens—**past, present, or future**. Each of these main tenses has four aspects: **simple, continuous, perfect, and perfect continuous**.

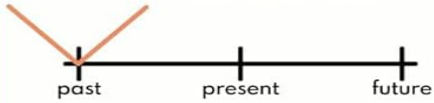
PAST

Simple Past



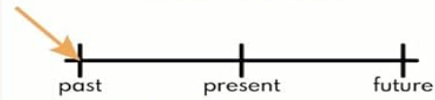
I wrote a book yesterday.

Past Continuous



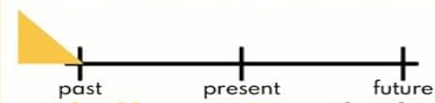
I was writing a book all day long.

I had written a book.

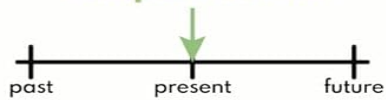
Past Perfect Continuous



I had been writing a book.

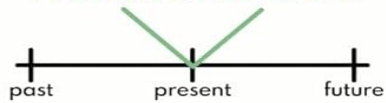
PRESENT

Simple Present



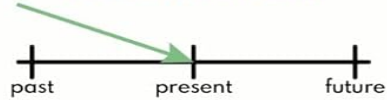
I write books.

Present Continuous



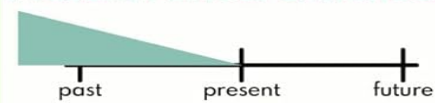
I am writing a book now.

I have been writing a book.

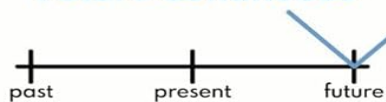
FUTURE

Simple Future



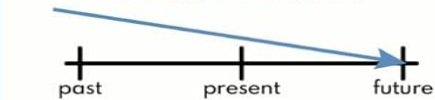
I will write a book.

Future Continuous



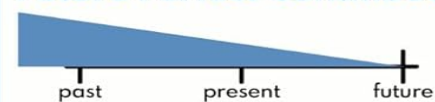
I will be writing a book.
