


Future Tense

Future Tense : Talking about the Future

1. **Simple Future:** Used for spontaneous decisions, predictions, and future plans.

 **Structure:**


- **Affirmative: Subject + will + Verb (base form) + Object**
- **Negative: Subject + will not (won't) + Verb (base form) + Object**
- **Question: Will + Subject + Verb (base form) + Object?**

 **Examples:**

They **will travel** to London next week. (*Affirmative*)

They **will not travel** to London next week. (*Negative*)

Will they travel to London next week? (*Question*)

 **Signal words:** *tomorrow, next week, in the future.*

2. **Future Continuous:** Used for actions that will be happening at a certain time in the future.

 **Structure:**


- **Affirmative: Subject + will be + Verb (-ing) + Object**
- **Negative: Subject + will not (won't) be + Verb (-ing) + Object**
- **Question: Will + Subject + be + Verb (-ing) + Object?**

 **Examples:**

She **will be working** at 8 PM. (*Affirmative*)

She **will not be working** at 8 PM. (*Negative*)

Will she be working at 8 PM? (*Question*)

 **Signal words:** *at this time tomorrow, next week, soon.*

3. **Future Perfect:** Used for actions that will be completed before a specific future time.

 **Structure:**


- **Affirmative: Subject + will have + Past Participle (V3) + Object**
- **Negative: Subject + will not have + Past Participle (V3) + Object**
- **Question: Will + Subject + have + Past Participle (V3) + Object?**

 **Examples:**

He **will have finished** the report by tomorrow. (*Affirmative*)

He **will not have finished** the report by tomorrow. (*Negative*)

Will he have finished the report by tomorrow? (*Question*)

 **Signal words:** *by, before, by the time.*

4. **Future Perfect Continuous:** Used for actions that will continue for a period of time before a specific future moment.

 **Structure:**


- **Affirmative: Subject + will have been + Verb (-ing) + Object**
- **Negative: Subject + will not have been + Verb (-ing) + Object**
- **Question: Will + Subject + have been + Verb (-ing) + Object?**

 **Examples:**

I **will have been working** here for five years next month. (*Affirmative*)

I **will not have been working** here for five years next month. (*Negative*)

Will I have been working here for five years next month? (*Question*)

 **Signal words:** *for, since, by then.*

Let's look at examples:

	Affirmative Examples	Negative Examples	Question Examples
Simple future tense	He will start his new job soon.	He will not start his new job soon.	Will he start his new job soon?
future continuous tense	hey will be traveling next week.	They will not be traveling next week.	Will they be traveling next week?
future perfect tense	He will have saved enough money by the end of the year.	He will not have saved enough money by the end of the year.	Will he have saved enough money by the end of the year?
future perfect continuous tense	She will have been studying for hours by the time the test starts.	She will not have been studying for hours by the time the test starts.	Will she have been studying for hours by the time the test starts?
