

## Future tense

### Exercise 4: Correct the Mistakes in the Sentences

1. **Incorrect:** By next year, she will studies at university.  
**Correct:** By next year, she **will study** at university. (*Simple Future: "will" + base verb*)
2. **Incorrect:** At 5 p.m. tomorrow, I will have watching TV.  
**Correct:** At 5 p.m. tomorrow, I **will be watching** TV. (*Future Continuous: "will be" + verb + -ing*)

3. **Incorrect:** When you get home, I will have be cooking dinner.  
**Correct:** When you get home, I **will be cooking** dinner. (*Future Continuous: "will be" + verb + -ing*)
4. **Incorrect:** By 2026, we will working in the same company for 10 years.  
**Correct:** By 2026, we **will have been working** in the same company for 10 years. (*Future Perfect Continuous: "will have been" + verb + -ing*)
5. **Incorrect:** He will waits for us at the station.  
**Correct:** He **will wait** for us at the station. (*Simple Future: "will" + base verb*)
